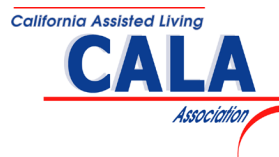

## ASSISTED LIVING AND THE VA AID AND ATTENDANCE BENEFIT

If you are a Veteran or surviving spouse, you may qualify for help paying for Assisted Living through the VA Aid and Attendance Benefit



## WHAT IS THE AID AND ATTENDANCE (A&A) BENEFIT?

The A&A is a federal monthly benefit that qualified veterans and their surviving spouses can receive to help with the cost of care when they require assistance with certain activities of daily living (ADLs). Through the A&A, an increased monthly pension amount to pay for the cost of care for ADLs can be used to pay for Assisted Living.



## WHAT IS THE ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA?

Veterans and surviving spouses eligible for a VA pension can apply for the A&A. This benefit is in addition to the pension and is paid monthly<sup>1</sup>. According to the California Department of Veterans Affairs<sup>2</sup>, applicants must meet one of the following conditions:

- » The veteran requires the aid of another person in order to perform ADLs such as bathing, feeding, etc.
- » The veteran is bedridden, due to a disability
- » The veteran is a patient in a nursing home due to mental or physical incapacity
- » The veteran has 5/200 visual acuity or less in both eyes, or concentric contraction of the visual field is 5 degrees or less



## HOW DO I APPLY?

### IN PERSON

### BY MAIL

Send a completed VA Form 21-2680 to the regional Pension Management Center (PMC) or to the closest VA regional office. Provide copies of evidence from your physician that will help support your claim.
